

# Intel Contingent Worker & Visitor Emergency Alert System

## Overview

Nixle is Intel's Emergency Notification System for alerting contingent workers (CWs) and visitors if certain emergency situations arise.

The purpose of this presentation is to give basic instructions and information to CWs and visitors on how to subscribe to Nixle.

To ensure the safety of **all** people either working at or visiting an Intel site, it is **strongly** requested that CWs and visitors subscribe so they can receive alerts by text.

This system is open to CWs and visitors at the following US sites:

# How to Subscribe

## Basic Instructions

CWs and visitors subscribe by texting the relevant site keyword to 333111, see list below. The system responds back with an acknowledgement and a request to reply to the SMS with your email address (Intel email or other). You can also use the 'One-step' QR Code option which will auto-create the SMS for you.

Individuals may unsubscribe at any time once assignment or visit has been completed by following the instructions sent with every message (also available on slide 9 of this presentation). CWs and visitors are strongly requested to retain subscription throughout their time at an Intel facility.

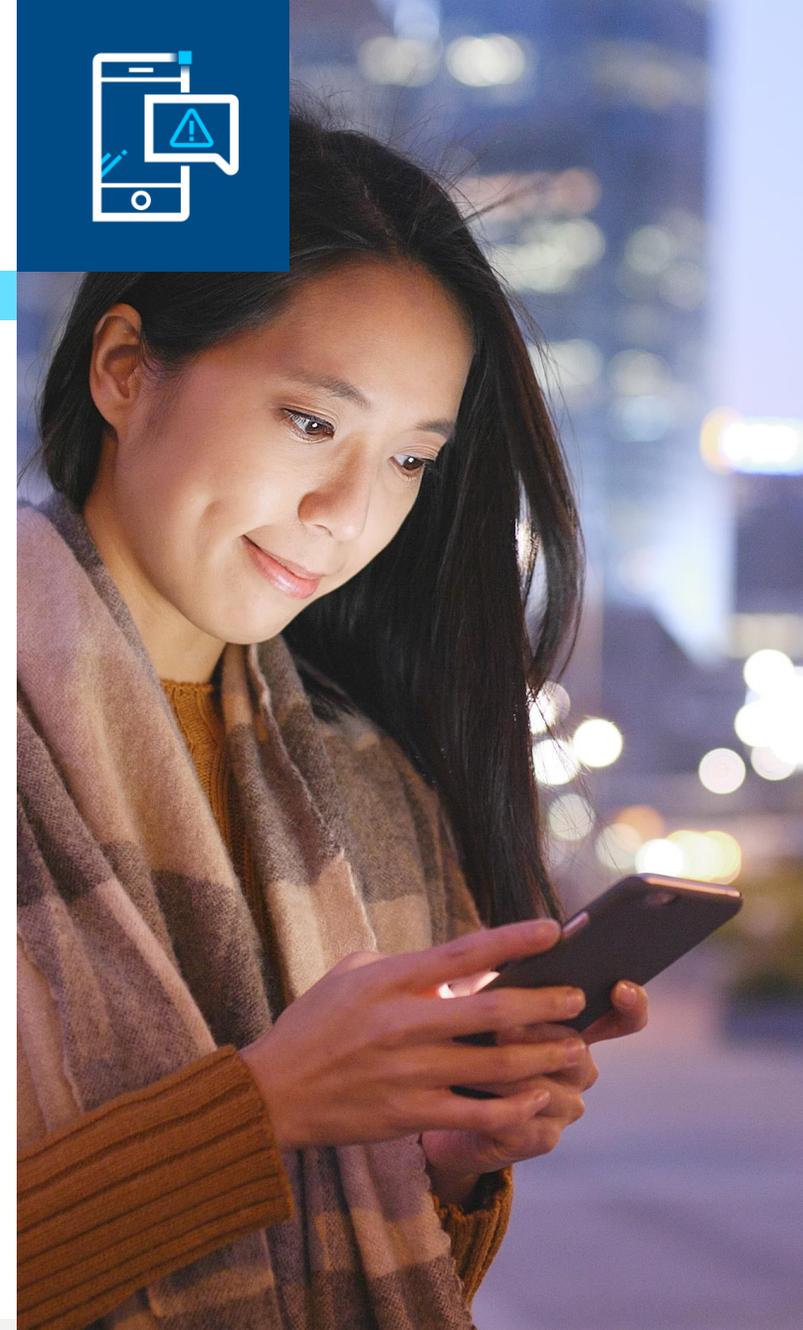
**Note: This system is only used for sharing emergency information from Intel.**

Select the relevant keyword for the site(s) you are working at from the list below and text to 333111 or use your phone camera app to scan the relevant site QR Code below:

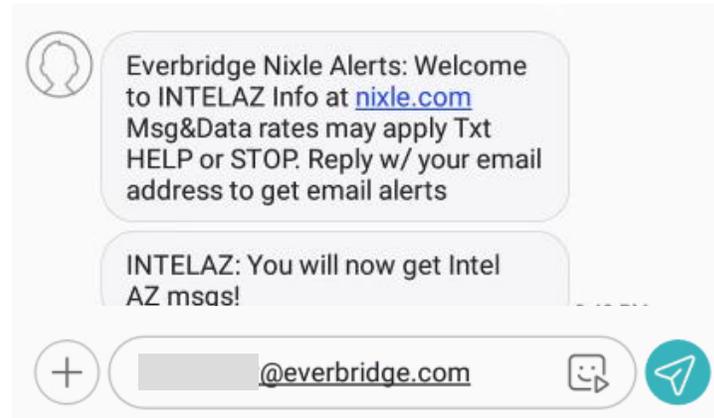

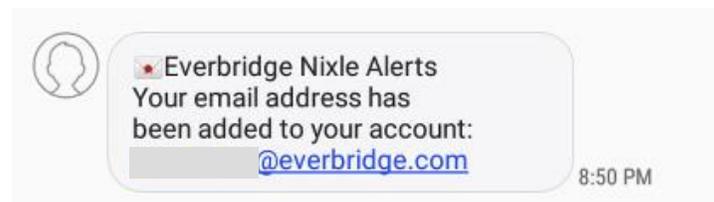
# Intel CW/Visitor Emergency Alerts

# Intel CW/Visitor Emergency Alerts

- Intel wants to ensure all workers are notified in an emergency. All CWs should subscribe to Intel's Emergency Notification alerts upon commencing work as a supplier with Intel. The system specifically targets CWs working on-site at Intel locations in AZ, FM, NM, OR, SC, CO, MA, TX and OH.
- Visitors to the sites listed can also subscribe to receive the alerts. It is important to receive emergency notifications when the rest of the site occupants do.
- By subscribing to this system, CW s/visitors will automatically receive the same information as Intel employees during campus/site-wide crisis situations, such as active threats.
- This system is managed by Intel Crisis Management which is part of Intel Corporate Security to ensure all employees, CWs and visitors receive relevant emergency notifications for these targeted sites.
- Intel's assigned system called [NIXLE](#) (part of Everbridge) operates through SMS and is available to anyone with a mobile device capable of sending and receiving SMS/text messaging.

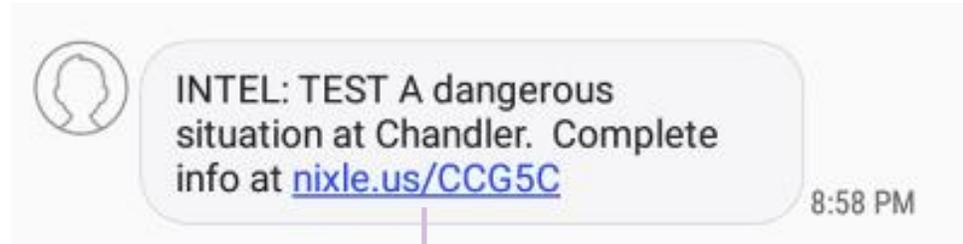
# Intel CW/Visitor Emergency Alerts - continued

- Intel does not have access to phone numbers (or any other personally identifiable information), nor can Intel “subscribe” any interested parties as any alert subscriptions must be initiated by the subscriber’s own mobile device.
- Although there is no charge to subscribe/unsubscribe or receive alerts, you may be charged for SMS/text messages if your mobile calling plan already charges you for SMS/text messages. Note: Intel is not responsible, nor will Intel reimburse for any such charges.
- As major campus/site-wide emergencies are very rare, the anticipated volume of messages will be low. CW Alerts are not sent for less severe events.
- While this service is currently in place only for the major US Sites, Intel Crisis Management is working to identify solutions for all locations.

# Intel CW/Visitor Emergency Alerts - Receiving Messages

## A Receiving Messages

You will receive messages just as you would any other text message.



*Nixle messages are deliberately short (under 130 characters). Key information is presented at the very beginning of the message.*

# How to unsubscribe from receiving alerts

## There are several ways you can unsubscribe if you are no longer working at or visiting an Intel site;

- Unsubscribe from text messages from a single site by texting STOP to 333111 and following any prompts provided.
- Unsubscribe from text messages from all sites by texting STOPALL to 333111 and following any prompts provided.
- Click the unsubscribe link found at the bottom of all Nixle email notifications.
