Personalized Learning

Personalized learning is the tailoring of pedagogy, curriculum and learning environments by learners or for learners in order to meet their different learning needs and aspirations.

Example Scenarios:


- 1) **Private feedback** – Through the private student notebooks encapsulated within the Class Notebook, teachers are able to view student work, and interact privately. This allows an individualized experience
- 2) **Individualized assignments** – Teachers are able to drop individualized assignments privately into a student's notebook, and differentiate in a way that can meet more needs of the students, whether struggling or advanced
- 3) **Multi-modal feedback** – Teachers have the ability to give text, written, audio and video feedback to adapt to a student's style

There are many different ways that teachers are personalizing learning with OneNote


Teacher giving audio feedback for assignments


Real-time Feedback

Example Scenarios:

- 1) **Short learning cycle** – The teacher can quickly pull up any private student work in real-time and give quick feedback or formative assessment. This shortens the learning cycle dramatically
- 2) **Individualized attention** – Now possible with Class Notebooks and private student sections. Able to differentiate and individualize much faster with all input types. Increased quality and quantity of feedback
- 3) **Project based learning** – Able to give real-time feedback to group projects in real time, which can help spur the group to deeper learning. Also give private feedback to a student who then injects the learning into the group

Many teachers have called this real-time feedback aspect of Class Notebooks a “game changer”


Engagement and Accountability

Example scenarios:


1. **All in one place** – Using class notebooks, all of the student work is captured in one place, never lost, and teachers can see exactly what is being done
2. **Real time feedback** – with Class Notebooks and real-time feedback, teachers can provide quick intervention, leading to higher engagement
3. **Accountable** – Because a teacher can show the class notebook easily on screen at any time showing any student with a click, students are more likely to be prepared

Inclusive Classroom

Example scenarios:


1. **Discreet feedback** – The private student areas in Class Notebooks allow teachers to discreetly give feedback and help without calling out specific students
2. **ParaEducators** – added as co-teachers in a Class Notebook to allow proximity independence for special needs students. The ParaEducator now sit in back of the room and can give private feedback and work with students
3. **Dyslexia** – OneNote's organizational model helps dyslexic students keep up in class more effectively. In addition, Learning Tools for OneNote helps address literacy and dyslexia
4. **Learning Styles** – OneNote's multi-modal inputs and flexibility appeals to a diverse set of learners and learning styles





Example scenarios:

1. **Student athletes** – Riding the bus and doing homework using Class Notebooks' offline capabilities
2. **Title I Schools** – Students where families don't have WiFi or internet access at home
3. **Scotland** – Moving all curriculum into OneNote Class Notebooks and using Class Notebooks' offline capabilities because many students don't have internet access at home on small islands.


