# Supplement to: Importance of Hand Washing

COVID-19 may be transmitted when a person touches a contaminated object and then touches their eyes, nose, or mouth. Washing your hands is easy, and it's one of the most effective ways to prevent the spread of germs. If soap and water are not readily available, you can use hand sanitizer with at least 60% ethanol (preferred) or 70% isopropanol (if the product is inaccessible to unsupervised children).

Hand sanitizer may not work if hands are soiled.

# Supplement to: Facemasks

Intel requires facemask use at all Intel sites in Phase 0, 1 and 2, and recommends facemask use at all sites in Phase 3 of Intel's return to workplace process. Intel is providing facemasks for personnel working on-site or if you prefer, you can wear your own personal cloth facemask. Employees and contingent workers should continue to comply with any PPE/safety requirements for their business unit or work area with respect to face coverings. For example, for cleanroom spaces, face coverings must comply with any specs/gowning requirements.

There are no exceptions to required mask use for medical, religious, or other reasons; CWs should work with their employer for any accommodations needed.

Please note that cloth and surgical facemasks are not considered respiratory protective devices subject to OSHA respiratory protection and PPE standards.

# Supplement to: Social Distancing

When wearing a mask, you must continue to observe all our social distancing guidelines and other safety practices. Particles containing the virus can travel more than six feet, especially indoors, so physical distancing must be combined with other controls, including face coverings and hand hygiene, to be effective.

# When to Return to Work

**Symptomatic COVID-19 Diagnosis:** Workers should remain away from work at an Intel site until they are symptom free for 3 days without the use of fever-reducing medications; significant improvement in cough to no more than infrequent cough and improvement in other symptoms; AND it has been at least 10 days since onset of symptoms, unless additional time is directed by physician or local government regulation.

**Asymptomatic COVID-19 Diagnosis:** Workers should remain away from work at an Intel site 10 days from the date on which the positive test was performed, unless additional time is directed by physician or local government regulation.

Public Health officials generally recommend testing for the following groups of people:

- Anyone experiencing any COVID-19 symptoms should get tested.
- Anyone, whether they have symptoms, who has been exposed to someone who was confirmed to have COVID-19.
- Anyone who has been referred by a local Public Health Department to their healthcare provider for COVID-19 testing.
